DEMENTIA FRIENDLY MONTGOMERY COUNTY

As part of a growing global movement, Montgomery County is embracing the concept of Dementia Friendly America™, a public-private partnership designed to create dementia-friendly communities.

In mid-January, Catherine and a dozen volunteers attended a presentation by JSSA to learn about the signs and symptoms of dementia, and what does and doesn't work when dealing with people with dementia. Dementia is an umbrella term for cognitive impairment, which has various causes (including Alzheimer's) and worsens over time. By changing how people think, act, and talk about dementia, there is less fear and avoidance, and people living with dementia are included and supported to live independently for longer.

HELP AFTER A HOSPITAL STAY

If you have been hospitalized, remember that once you return home Chevy Chase At Home can assist you by:

- Driving you to follow-up doctor's visits, physical therapy appointments, and prescription pickups at the pharmacy,
- Taking out weekly recycling and performing other minor household chores,
- Providing a friendly visit while you are home and can't get out.

While we do not provide direct medical care, such as administer pharmaceuticals or change bandages, we can help you contact services that do provide such care in the home.

LET'S WELCOME THE RESIDENTS OF RCCC!

In 2018, in response to the expansion of existing villages near to us, the County asked CC@H to review and clarify its geographic boundaries. The Membership Committee recommended and the Executive Committee approved the expansion of CC@H's boundaries along the west-northwest edge of the Town of Chevy Chase to the intersection of Wisconsin and Montgomery avenues. As a result of this expansion, The Riviera of Chevy Chase Condominiums (RCCC), a building with about 170 units, is now included in the CC@H service area. In January 2019, Dan O'Laughlin, a RCCC resident and Friend of CC@H, trained as a volunteer and joined the Membership Committee. In February 2019 an invitation to join CC@H and to attend an information session in the RCCC party room was sent to each resident. On the evening of February 13, Dan and Catherine McCallum met with RCCC residents and several expressed interest in participating in Chevy Chase At Home.

YOU MIGHT HAVE MISSED – AARP SMART DRIVER COURSE

Twenty-six hardy souls braved the prediction of imminent snow to appear at the CC Village Hall for the AARP Smart Driver Course on January 29. The excellent AARP volunteer instructor, Kenneth Ow, wasted no time and whizzed us through the material in the provided workbook, so that we were back on the road by 2 p.m., as the first snowflakes were falling. Despite one's driving experience, there was certainly new information to be learned and old information to be reminded of!

MARK SHIELDS: REFLECTIONS ON THE MID-TERMS

On December 4 Mark Shields, PBS Newshour political analyst and commentator, spoke to an enthusiastic, overflow crowd at Chevy Chase Village Hall. His often witty, always spot-on comments covered a wide range of observations about the recent mid-term elections. He made many cogent points about the changes evidenced in the results and observed that beyond the normal discussions of red and blue trends, one of the most important factors to emerge was actually green – the tremendous, record-breaking sums that had been spent.

Though he did not specifically cite its report, the Center for Responsive Politics published figures that put total spending at \$5.2 billion, up 35% from the comparable 2014 figure. Non-party outside spending increased 84 percent over 2014 as it ballooned to nearly \$1.1 billion.
